
CCBOR Timeline



Group proposes CBOR Charter Amendment to disposal of its waste.

2020

March-June, 2020

Group suspended campaign due to COVID-19, with about 3 months to go, having collected nearly 9000 signatures.

Group asked City Council to extend deadline - City Council refused.

Group asked City Council to put CBOR on the ballot - Again, City Council refused.

Group sued City asking for a temporary restraining order (TRO) and to make up the 3 months when safe.

Judge ruled against **TRO.** City Attorney and judge expected group to petition during pandemic.

Group filed petitions by City's deadline. Effort fell short with 6420 out of the 9870 required valid signatures.

This timeline illustrates the journey of the Columbus Community Bill of Rights through the present. The people of Ohio have the constitutional right to propose laws, and every attempt by CCBOR volunteers has been to give the voters of Columbus a voice in protecting their water and environment.
